CLEAN WATER & COMMUNITY

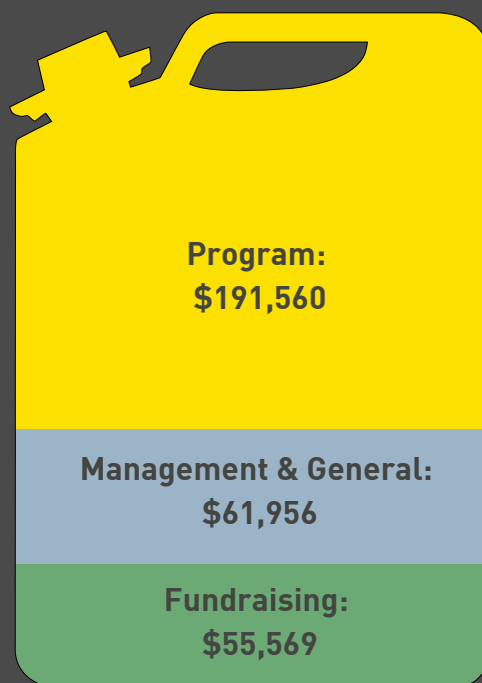

YEAR IN REVIEW

Let's be honest. Recently, the passage of time has been super funky. It feels nearly impossible to measure. So, when we try to reflect on the things that happened within our 2021 fiscal year, it helped to make ourselves a list:

- August 2020: We renovated our current office and build space in Grandville, MI.
- October 2020: We started hosting small filter builds! Then, stopped in November when the second wave of COVID-19 hit Michigan hard over the holidays.
- January 2021: Our staff in Rwanda let us know that they were running low on supplies because teams in the field had found creative ways to continue their work. We realized we needed to send a shipping container as soon as possible to refresh their inventory.
- March 2021: We very carefully planned a World Water Day Filter Build Marathon.
- April 2021: With a lot of help from our partners and volunteers, we managed to send out a shipping container of supplies to Rwanda.
- June 2021: We welcomed three new board members to 20 Liters.

Last year was filled with the unexpected – both challenges and blessings. And as we reflect, there is one thing that is certain: we wouldn't have made it through without your support. Your gifts of time, your prayers, and your continued, generous financial support made all the difference to our staff and volunteers both here in West Michigan and in Rwanda.

CELEBRATING WORLD WATER DAY

Every year, on March 22nd, 20 Liters joins our peers across the globe to celebrate World Water Day. This year, we found out only weeks beforehand that we needed to accelerate our timeline to send filter components to Rwanda as soon as possible. And so, we called on our volunteers and other partners to help us complete one of the most vital and least glamorous parts of our work - packing boxes.

On World Water Day, we invited 9 small groups of volunteers to participate in our first ever Filter Build Marathon. In less than 24 hours, 56 volunteers helped us finish building component parts and pack 2,460 SAM3 filters into 82 boxes. They also helped us raise funds to pay for the unexpected cost of shipping these filters to Rwanda. And thanks to our volunteers, and a generous gift from Mars Hill Bible Church; we were able to send a fully stocked shipping container to Rwanda to resupply our local volunteers in April.

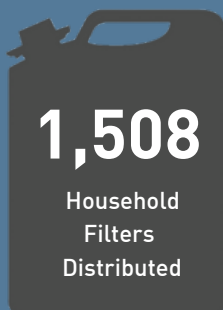
